

IPCCC Remote presentation policy

Summary

IEEE requires authors of accepted papers to present their paper at the conference in order for a paper to appear in the conference proceedings, and in IEEE Xplore.

However we understand that there may be rare circumstances that NONE of the paper authors are able to present the paper in person. Under such confirmed circumstances, IPCCC can make arrangements for remote participation due to an unpredictable event such a US Visa denial, Government restrictions on travel or sudden illness. Remote participants will need to provide documentation of the reason and pay the paper registration fee and a remote participation fee to cover network bandwidth costs. Specific details will be provided to all authors whose papers are accepted.

Dear potential IPCCC Author:

IEEE requires authors of accepted papers to present their paper at the conference in order for a paper to appear in the conference proceedings, and in IEEE Xplore.

We understand that there may be rare circumstances that NONE of the paper authors are able to present the paper in person, IPCCC can make arrangements for remote participation under the following conditions

- Remote participation will only be considered after an accepted author has submitted their camera-ready manuscript, paid the full conference registration fee, made a remote participation request, and paid the remote participation fee. There will be a limited number of remote participants allowed at the conference.
- All remote participation requests must be accompanied with a valid reason that warrant an exception to be made, along with formal documentation justifying the nature, validity and unavoidability of the conflict.
- A predictable or schedulable event that the authors are either aware of before the paper acceptance notification, or have control over, does NOT qualify for an exception. Examples that DO NOT qualify include: scheduled student exams, presentations or defenses; other conflicting travel arrangements of the presenting author; financial reasons, and other events of a similar nature.
- An unpredictable or uncontrollable event that prevents an author from attending qualifies as an acceptable reason, such as unexpected personal injury before the conference (with formal doctor's statement), flight delay, travel restrictions by the government and so on. Documentation is required to validate the reason and provide a basis for the exception.
- A denied US visa application or a prolonged visa processing time for the visa interview can be regarded as a valid reason but the author must demonstrate due diligence in applying for and obtaining a US visa to attend the conference.
- Remote presentation may either occur at conference during special time periods or on a separate Remote IPCCC day before the conference. Remote presentations will require a 15 minute video taped presentation that will be presented via Zoom. The Remote session chair may decide whether to show the video or have the author give a live zoom

presentation. Authors will need to be present to check-in at the beginning of the session and be present at the end of their paper presentation to answer questions.

- In order to arrange for the network bandwidth required for remote participation, the conference will incur additional costs and there will be a Remote participation fee of \$250 for such participation.
